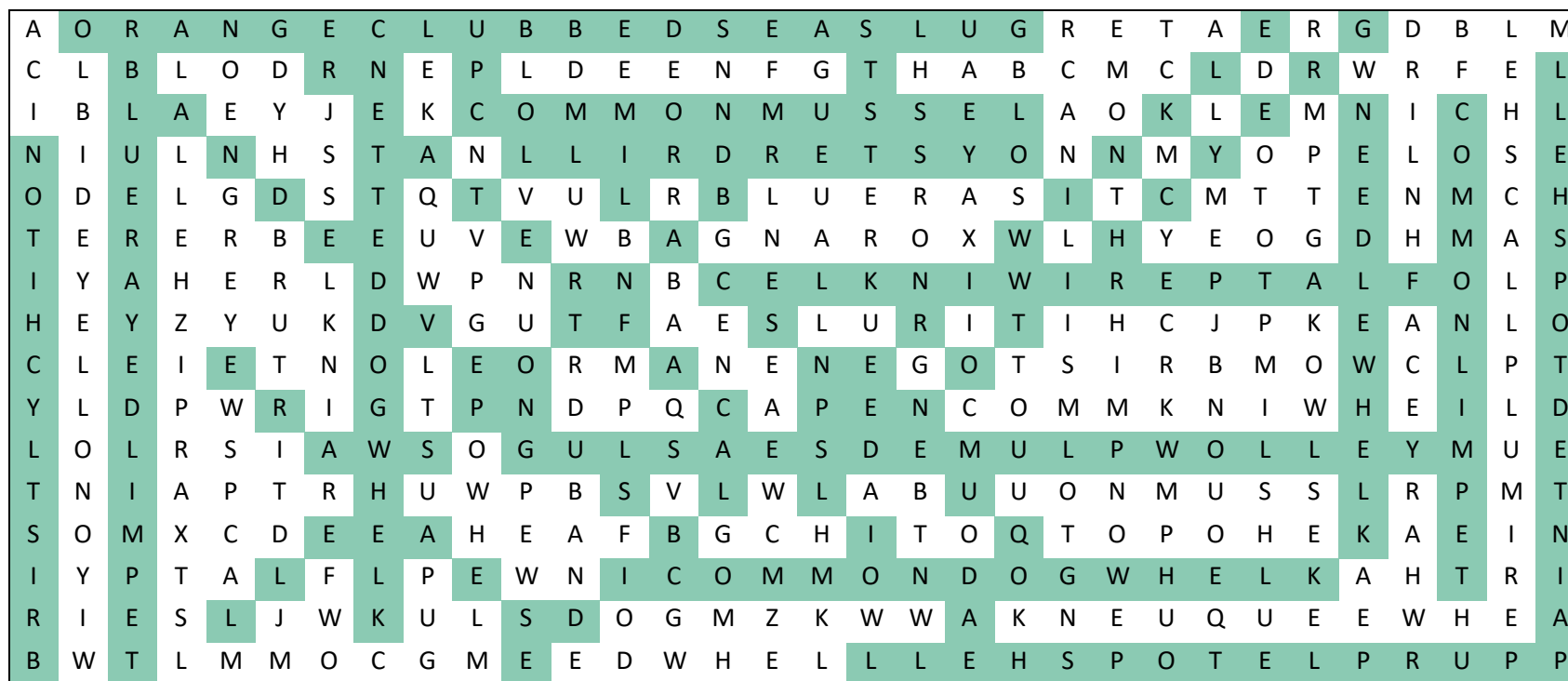


Rocky Shore Molluscs Wordsearch

Molluscs are soft-bodied creatures, most of which protect their body with a hard shell. There are three main types of molluscs that you are likely to find on rocky shores, which you can easily tell apart by their shells. Chitons protect themselves with rows of armoured plates, bivalves have paired shells, and gastropods have a single shell (although some gastropods, such as sea hares and sea slugs have lost their shells through evolution). On the attached page are pictures of 20 molluscs that you can find around the Cornish coast, but can you also find their names hidden in the wordsearch below?
